Dear Family,

Pop singer Belinda Carlisle reminds us in her 1987 hit “Heaven Is a Place on Earth” that “in heaven love comes first.” That’s what we want, isn’t it – in a cruel and broken world – for love to come first? This is the core meaning of Jesus’ most important words in the Gospel of Matthew, describing for us the importance of love, so that “the kingdom of heaven has come near” (Matthew 4:17).

We do not have to wait to experience heaven after we die. Our baptisms ground us in a heavenly way of life, not just in an eternal assurance. Baptism into Christ calls Christians to be responsible for helping to bring wholeness to a hurting world: to create heaven on earth. Beginning on Sunday, January 23rd and continuing through Sunday, February 27th our lectionary readings are allowing us to delve deeper into what it means for heaven to come to earth: studying Jesus’ words, his way of life, and the manner in which he loved. As we engage in conversation around the “Sermon on the Mount,” hopefully we will also discover that we are the change agents Jesus is calling forth to make the kingdom of heaven a reality on earth.

Below is the complete overview of the sermon series “Heaven on Earth”. The phrase “kingdom of heaven” does not have just one definition but is understood as God’s gracious vision for the world. Join us in our discovery of the kingdom of heaven here on earth.

Heaven on Earth

Sunday, January 23rd *Who wants heaven on earth?*

Jesus’ disciples were interested in the idea of heaven coming to earth, so much so they were willing to leave their comfort zones to make it a reality in the world in which they lived. (Matthew 4:12-23)

Sunday, January 30th *What does the kingdom of heaven have to do with us?*

As part of God’s kingdom, we are called to bring heaven on earth to others. (Matthew 5:1-12)

Sunday, February 6th *Are we the right ones to bring heaven to earth?*

Jesus asks us the question, “do you want to be a part of it?” It’s up to us to make daily decisions that help the kingdom come. (Matthew 5:13-20)

Sunday, February 13th *If this is heaven on earth, what’s up with all the laws?*

The kingdom of heaven has laws about how to live with God and each other. With Jesus’ help we are able to look deeper within God’s laws to see how “love comes first” when it comes to fulfilling heaven on earth. (Matthew 5:21-37)

Sunday, February 20th *Bringing heaven to earth sounds hard – do we have what it takes?*

Jesus asks for our faithfulness when it comes to creating heaven on earth. It may not be easy, but as we grow in understanding we will find we are strengthened to live it out. (Matthew 5:28-48)

Sunday, February 27th *Will you trust God for help in bringing heaven to earth?*

Heaven on earth is all that it is cracked up to be and more! There’s no turning back now. Encouraged by what the kingdom of heaven means for us and for all people, we are able to work alongside God to make it happen. (Matthew 6:24-34)

Church Council Minutes 8 December, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Arvid Flanum.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Lynn Munson. With additional giving the total amount given toward the parsonage loan was \$3,435. \$390 was raised by the Outdoor Chapel Progressive Dinner. The Roast Beef dinner raised \$1156 after expenses. A motion to accept the report was made by Pam, seconded by Rob. The motion carried.

Worship-Sandy

Advent banners are now being placed in the church. Three are done and one to go. They are talking about doing some more for Easter.

Fellowship-Michelle

Michelle talked with Barry Ausen about doing a roast beef sandwich dinner instead of a pot-luck on the third Sunday in January after church. Council members may be asked to provide salads and to serve. The greeters list is running low. Sign up please. The youth will be doing the service on Sunday the 12th.

Trustee Report

Gary reported that the new sign has been put up and it looks very good. There is a problem with sand in the valve in the toilet in the upstairs bathroom. The valve has been replaced and the filter will be replaced also. We should check with the well driller to see how it was set up. Dave will call and check it out. New toilets have been purchased for replacement in the parsonage. There is now another bid for the energy project for replacing the fluorescent lights in the basement. The complete project will be \$1520. There should also be rebates from Focus on Energy and Polk-Burnett for the project.

The insurance adjuster will come out as soon as the snow is off the roof of the church to look at the shingles.

Pastor's Report

The Christmas Eve and Sunday services will be advertised in the local papers. Next week a Christmas letter will be sent out to all members.

Long Range Planning

Arvid contacted the Synod about resources for long range and strategic planning. Amy Odogren suggested a book called "Living Lutheran" for us to start with that will help develop a strategic plan. She could then meet with the committee in a retreat setting to put the plan together. Two copies of the book have been ordered. After discussion about the idea of planning and strategy we decided we will start with those books and go from there.

Men's Group

Arvid suggested that we have a men's group that would meet on a Saturday morning for breakfast once a month at the church. The first one would be on the 8th of January at 08:00a.

Annual Meeting is set for the 6th of February. Arvid will be appointing the nominating committee.

Lynn brought up the idea that we have a publicity committee to take care of advertising our events and special services. Arvid appointed Lynn to chair the committee. Others will be contacted.

Pam, Lynn, and Eric reviewed a church management software program for accounting, financial records and church membership. We should be considering something like this because it is web based and can be easily transferred to someone else easily.

Review minutes: The minutes were read back. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Dave and seconded by Gary. The motion carried.

Church Council Minutes 12 January, 2011

The meeting was called to order by President Arvid Flanum. Devotions were presented by Pastor Kathy.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Lynn Munson. All the accounts like benevolence or cemetery have been paid out at for year end. Elaine Solum has donated a new Christmas tree for the church in memory of Bill. A motion to accept the report was made by Rob, seconded by Pam. The motion carried.

Worship-Sandy

They are discussing more opportunities for banners for the future like Easter. The outdoor chapel fund now has \$4,000. This will likely cover costs to finish the building. The wood for the ceiling will be purchased and treated before spring so it will be ready to go up.

Fellowship-Michelle

Elaine is working on the greeters list. Let her know if there is a month you would like. This Sunday is the roast beef sandwich dinner and we need some volunteers for salads and potatoes.

Trustee Report

Gary presented the report. The new lights have been put in for the basement and they are very noticeable. We still need to dispose of the old fixtures and tubes. If anyone wants the old fixtures or fluorescent tubes they are available.

The total cost was \$1520. There will be at least \$400 in rebates from Polk-Burnett. There was an energy audit done at the church and parsonage. St Croix Energy Solutions did the testing by pressurizing the building and then checking with infrared cameras to check for airflow. The report will not be ready until the next meeting. It looks like the biggest heat loss is in the ceiling of the sanctuary. There is a plan to have someone in to look at the sound system and make some recommendations. Dave noted that there are extra filters for the water in the upstairs bathroom.

Pastor's Report

Newsletter and bulletin information should be delivered and noted as to where they should be posted in plenty of time. Pastor Kathy is letting us know that she has been approached to do a short class on Social Networking.

Old Business

Men's group met last Saturday. There were 7 attending. The plan is to have some bible study and some community service. One idea is to volunteer time at Luther Point. 5 February is the next meeting at the Master's Touch in Amery.

Long Range Planning – we are still reading "Living Lutheran". We will continue until everyone on council has read it and then try to meet and discuss. Pastor Kathy will order 6 more to get more in the hands of the council.

We're taking a break now over the winter, but come April we'll be ready to start again. Some of us work over the winter at home, making blocks and tops. Join us in April to put them together. Thanks to everyone.
